## HOW TO GET TO FORT SCOTT

U. S. Route No. 27

- 0.0 CINCINNATI AUTOMOBILE CLUB  
Central Parkway at Walnut  
West on Parkway, 0.3 and R
- 4.2 Bear L into Ludlow Avenue
- 4.6 Knowlton's Corner, straight thru into Hamilton Avenue (U. S. 27)
- 4.7 Turn L, across R. R. into Blue Rock Street and ahead on U. S. 27
- 5.1 Bear R into Colerain Avenue
- 7.9 Mt. Airy, L on Blue Rock to New Baltimore
- 20.0 New Baltimore

AN organized and properly directed summer camp is one of the safest and best places for a boy during the summer months and every boy should be given an opportunity to spend at least two weeks in such a camp. Fort Scott offers this opportunity.

The camp overlooks the winding Big Miami River. It is located on a high knoll from where one can get a panoramic view of miles and miles of beautiful scenery. It is sheltered by large trees of many varieties, satisfying the boy's curiosity for woodcraft. Here are the homes of many birds and animals attracting the attention of boys who desire to study the haunts and habits of these little creatures.

At Camp Scott a boy is taught to become self-reliant, learn more of initiative that enables him to meet competition in later life successfully, and every moment while there his time is occupied with a worthwhile program under expert supervision. The finest type of youth are his companions. He lives in the open, gets plenty of sleep in clean, dry quarters and his meals are pure and wholesome.

A resident chaplain holds Mass each day, aiding the home, school and Church during the time when the boy needs it most.

### IMPORTANT CHANGES IN FORT SCOTT CAMP FOR SEASON OF 1932

1. First two weeks for girls, June 27th to July 10th.
2. All applicants will be examined by their family doctor. The medical blank is on the reverse side of the application.
3. Visiting days on Sunday ONLY, when special features are given at the Camp; parents will be notified. Parents who cannot visit their boys or girls on Sunday, may secure permission from Camp Director.

### INFORMATION

Upon arrival at camp, every boy will be required to deposit his money in the camp bank to be drawn as necessity demands. Any amount left to his credit at the close of the camp period will be refunded.

A Camp Trading Post is maintained where camp stationery, stamps, high-grade candies and other sweets are handled. Each camper is permitted to purchase a limited amount.

An honor system adapted from that used by the famous Chief Tecumseh is an interesting feature for campers.

No boy is permitted to eat between meals or to have candy or other eatables in his tent.

Any food or candy brought into camp must be turned over to the Commissary Department.

No boy permitted to leave camp without written permission from the Camp Director.

No firearms are allowed in camp.

*The order of the day is the program of the camp. No one will be excused unless ill.*

Swimming is permitted at specified times ONLY and then competent instructors and life savers are always on guard. No swimming except in the pool.

No fires are to be built or trees cut down without first consulting the Camp Director.

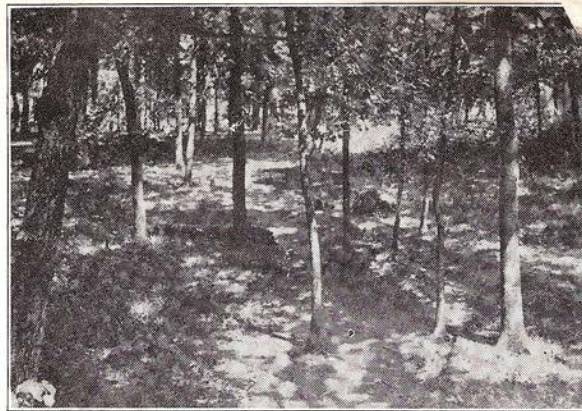
Tent houses are cleaned and inspected daily. Every boy must have a physical examination before entering camp.

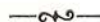
### VISITORS

## FORT SCOTT CAMP FOR GIRLS

June 27 to July 10, 1932



The camp is under the supervision of W. D. Morrissey, Director of the Boys' Camp. Mr. Morrissey has gathered a group of experienced councilors, who know how to supervise the girls of camp age. The young ladies are very proficient in camp lore. Parents can be assured of the proper wholesome recreation; also that their daughter will be safe in Body and Soul while enjoying her vacation.

The same facilities offered the boys at Fort Scott will be offered to girl campers.

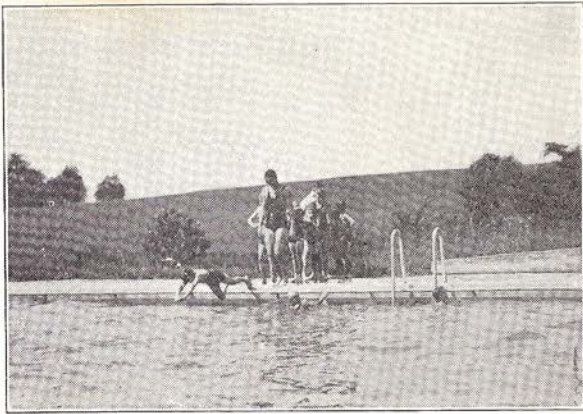
Read carefully the entire booklet as practically the same information holds for both boys and girls.

The first two weeks are given to the girls this year, in order to avoid the cooler weather that comes generally towards the end of August.

We would suggest that you bring plenty of bed clothing, also warm wearing apparel, and avoid high heeled shoes. Rain coats are essential. We might also mention sheets; girls will probably want them, the boys are not so particular. The best type of uniform is knickers or shorts, and Khaki, of course, is the most serviceable.

The same application blank will be used as that for the boy campers. All applications must be filled out carefully and signed.

The medical certificate is on the reverse side of the application, and must be filled out by your local physician before mailing to the office. Please note that no medical examinations will be made in the office this year, and all applications must be sent in accompanied by the doctor's signature.



The camp fee is Sixteen Dollars for a two-weeks' period; \$2.00 must accompany each application. No application will be accepted for less than the two-week period.

Register early in order to be assured that you will have a place at Camp.

### Where Is It?

The camp is located on the Big Miami River midway between Venice and New Baltimore. It is about twenty miles from Cincinnati. The high, dry site, the grove of trees and the excellent swimming pool make it as nearly an ideal spot as can be found.

### How Much Does It Cost?

A camp period is two weeks and costs \$16.00, or \$8.00 a week for each of the two weeks.

### Refunds

No refunds will be made to any boy who leaves camp before his time is up, except in case of illness; and then only upon the written recommendation of the camp physician. No refund will be made for odd days.

### Equipment

Boys will be sheltered in tent houses. These houses have a substantial floor and roof and walls which can be raised or lowered to meet weather conditions.

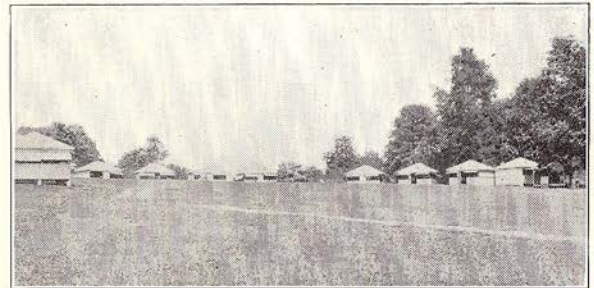
### Sanitation and Health

### What Must He Bring?

All boys must bring the same uniforms, consisting of 1 pair of khaki trousers, 1 pair khaki shorts, 2 khaki shirts, 1 belt. *The Big Store Boys' Department, S. E. Corner Seventh and Race Streets, Cincinnati, O.,* will supply the uniform to all boys at a very reasonable cost. Besides the above, two blankets, comb and brush, toothbrush, tooth paste, bar of soap, underclothing, handkerchiefs, pajamas, 2 bath towels, needle and thread, bathing trunks and gym shoes, knife, pillow, and collapsible drinking cup.
